

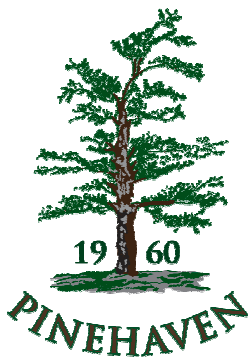

President's Message

I extend a warm welcome to our members, new and returning alike, to what I hope will soon be the start of our 2011 golf season. As this is being written, we still have over a foot of snow-pack on our golf course and, as a consequence, do not expect to open by April 1st. We are hopeful that the course will soon be open for play and can all look forward to a fine golf season at Pinehaven.

There have been some changes to the Club since we ended our 2010 season that I would like to share with you. All of our key staff are returning this year: Mike Jewell, our Club Manager; Scott Warren, our Head Pro; Rob Bigley, our Greens Superintendent; Chrystal Liddle, our Office Manager; and Siver Hills Restaurant and Banquet House, headed by Anthony Adonnino and Head Chef, Justin Engineri. Also returning are Scott's Assistant Pro, Brian Pierotti. Scott's other Assistant, Kevin Bennison, has left to take a position at Taconic Golf Club in Williamstown. Replacing Kevin is Assistant Professional Davana Kessler, a native of Pennsylvania and a graduate of the Professional Golf Management Program at Methodist University in North Carolina. Please welcome Davana to Pinehaven when you meet her.

With membership levels below our maximum limit of 335, some have questioned why we chose to retain a second Assistant Professional. Our reasoning is that we do not wish to reduce the level of member service that would result by having one less professional. As it now stands, the Pro Shop's hours of operation when a professional is on duty (generally 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m.) are among the longest of any private Club in the area. Our members expect this level of service, and we want this to continue. Removing an Assistant Pro would reduce the hours when the Shop is staffed by a professional. This is but one example of where Pinehaven is unique in that it can, in this economy, maintain an exceptional course, Club amenities and a high level of service without having to drastically increase dues.

Another change that we will institute this year is to provide non-stockholder members with more financial information regarding the operation of the Club. While we will continue to retain an amount of financial information in order to assure proper stockholder confidentiality, some information will be shared so that our entire membership can better appreciate the financial pressures we face and our need to have every member serve as our ambassador to attract new memberships and other sources of income.

You will see that we have revised our Club committees with new Chairs and members. In addition, each committee is expected to hold, at a minimum, four meetings each year, which are now being noted in our Calendar of Events and Activities posted in the Chatterbox and online on our website. Each committee chairperson has expressed an interest in adding new members who are interested in serving. If there is any particular committee or committees which interest you, please contact our Club Manager, Mike Jewell, who can set it up.

It is still too early to assess how our course weathered the winter weather, but preliminary indications are that we appear to have come through the winter months just fine. We will know more once the snow clears and we begin to examine plant growth. After the Club closed last year, we were able to continue with our tree-cutting/clearing plan and purchased additional non-permeable greens covers, bring the number to seven covers that we have purchased and installed over the past two seasons.

We have also had changes to Pinehaven's Board of Directors since the end of last season. New to the Board this year are Bill Toomey, Kevin Justice and Mike VanBuren. They replace our former Board members, Glenn Gray, Tom Mawalt and Don Bourgeois. While Don had one year remaining on his term, he was forced to resign over the winter in order to honor a commitment he made to another volunteer organization. For everyone associated with our organization, I extend my sincerest thanks to Glenn, Tom and Don for their hard work and commitment and look forward to the valuable contributions that will be given to Pinehaven by Bill, Kevin and Mike.

We are optimistic that our membership levels will reach, if not exceed, our budgeted projections, as we already are seeing a considerable amount of membership interest. While the recent unfortunate events involving Normanside Country Club play a part in this interest, we are also seeing interest beyond Normanside by individuals who are considering our Club. COURSE CHATTER

My staff and I would like to welcome everyone back for the 2011 season. We also would like to welcome our new members. I am sure your experience here at Pinehaven will be an enjoyable one.

How has the course wintered?

I am writing this article on March 25 and the winter seems to be lingering on this year. As everyone knows, winter injury has plagued many courses the last couple of years and it is difficult to determine at this time how our course has wintered. Winter injury to the turf is a very complex problem and recently has gained a lot of attention. Many universities and associations are committing resources to finding answers for this problem and are recommending some remedies Pinehaven has already committed to.

Pinehaven has been very pro-active with implementing processes that could help minimize injury such as; 1) various cultural and agronomic changes, 2) tree removal and pruning, 3) and the use of impermeable covers during the winter season. The changes made will also benefit the turf during the entire year which will create better playing conditions. Even though there are no guarantees that the aforementioned items will completely alleviate winter injury we have already seen improvements since their implementation. Right now, we are cautiously optimistic about our spring course conditions.

2011 Tree Removal Update:

Trees are an important part of Pinehaven's character. There has always been a balance between trees and having quality turf from which to play. The trees can be detrimental to healthy turf because of the increased shade and roots. When we discuss what trees to remove there is always consideration of how the removal of trees will impact the integrity of the hole versus what turf benefits are being gained. The decision of removing what trees and from what area takes years of evaluating each site, using the master plan as a guide, and much discussion from everyone involved. After trees are removed, the site is re-evaluated to determine the positive impact of the removal and if any other trees need to be removed or pruned.

The purpose of tree removal or pruning is to:

- 1) Improve the turf quality by improving sunlight, air circulation and eliminate root competition.
- 2) Improve playability by improving turf quality.
- 3) Eliminate liability with the removal of dead trees and/or branches.

The locations we selected focused primarily on the south and south-east side of greens and tees which will allow for the very beneficial morning sun. Locations selected included: 1) Tee #1, Green #2, Tee #5, Snack Shack area, Green #11, Tee #12, Rough #15 rt. side (grove) and Green #18.

I thought there was a lot of work (trees removed) done for the price we received. The logistics of getting a tree company to an off road site (ie: # 5 tee) can be challenging during a very snowy winter but I thought the overall project went very well.

Lawn Tips for Homeowners:

If you are considering a lawn care program for the year (fertilizer, crabgrass, weed, and insect control) the Scotts 4-step, Agway 4-step or Hewitts 4-step are good products.

For prevention of crabgrass, your application timing is important. The application has to be done before the crabgrass seed starts to germinate which is usually when the Forsythia Bush is in bloom, sometime in April. It is helpful to time your application with a moderate rain event. If you need to do any seeding to your lawn, make sure to get a product that you can seed with. Many crab control products you cannot use a seed before or after the application. Read the entire label or ask the sales person if you have any questions.

I have had many questions in the past regarding getting crabgrass along their driveway edge, and not any on the rest of the lawn, after a crab control product was applied? This is because the black pavement has warmed the soil around the edge of the driveway sooner than the rest of your lawn, which will germinate the crabgrass seed in the soil sooner.

Thank you for your patience and support. I hope everyone has a great 2011 golf season.

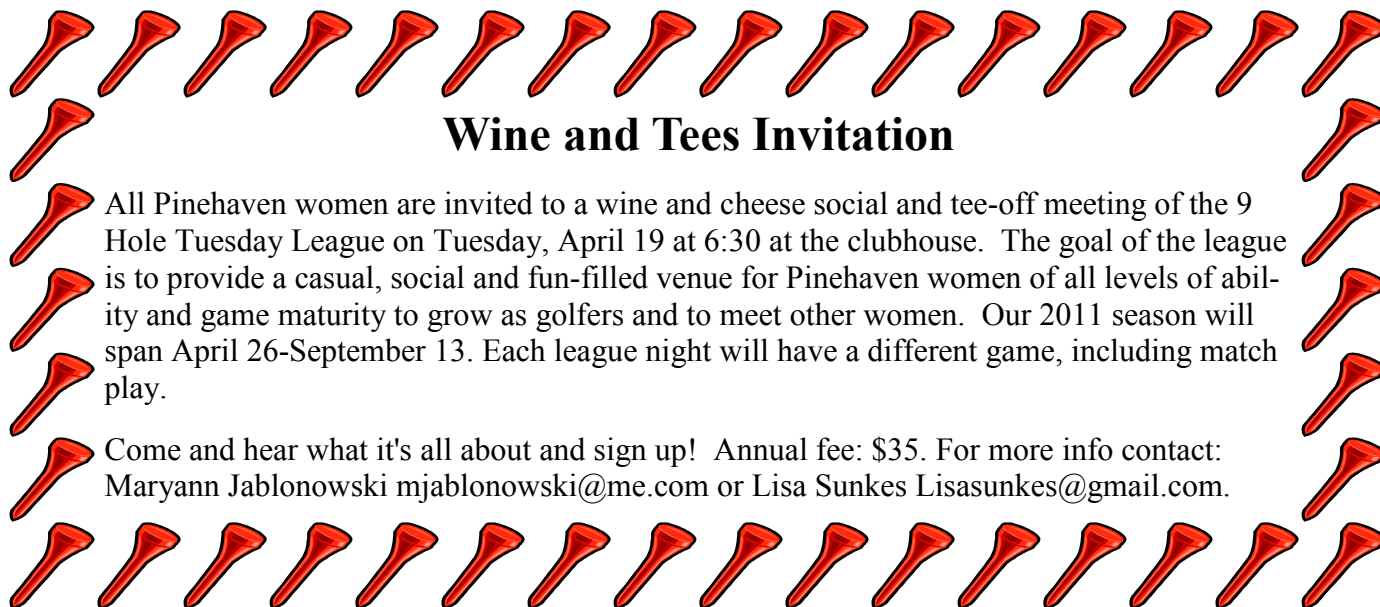

Hole in One Insurance



NEW FOR 2011

If you would like “hole in one” insurance for the 2011 season the cost to register is \$10. You can register in the Pro Shop or by emailing propcc@nycap.rr.com. Once you have registered the rebilling fee is \$3.00 per hole in one. If you make a hole in one you will receive:

1. a custom paver by the putting green commemorating your hole in one
2. a credit on your tab account
3. a credit on your pro shop account

***Tab and Pro Shop credits will be based on total number of entrants in the insurance fund. The amounts will be posted in the Pro Shop.

Club Fitting

Golfers who invest in their game by purchasing a new set of clubs should make one more investment, too: getting custom fit. Every golfer is a bit different in size, body shape and the shape of their golf swing. Custom fitting results in clubs that are specifically suited to an individual's height, strength, club head speed and swing characteristics. Contrary to the belief of many, club fitting does not have to be a time-consuming or expensive endeavor. A very basic club fitting might take as little as 15 minutes, with the average being 30-45 minutes. It is best to do a club fitting outdoors so that the ball flight can be observed. By watching the ball flight produced by each variation of a club, and checking the impact marks left on adhesive strips attached to the clubface and sole, a recommendation can be made for the best combination of shaft (length, flex and kick point), loft (standard, strong or flat), lie (strong or flat), grip and swing weight, among other factors. The Golf Professional Staff at Pinehaven Country Club recommends that you get custom fit before purchasing new clubs. There is no charge for our custom fitting services and we will give you trade in credit, on your old clubs, towards the purchase of your new equipment.

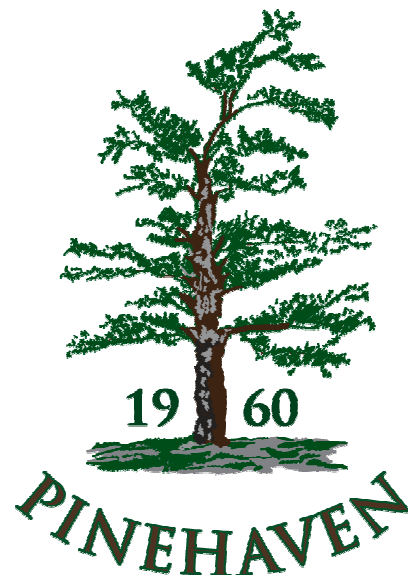

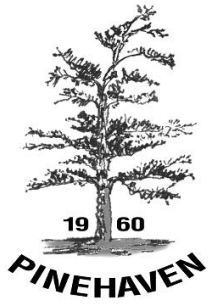
